
## THE PASTOR'S 15<sup>th</sup> Sunday -Matthew 13:1-23

God reveals to us and communicates with us continuously through persons, works and situations. The word of God comes gently and is never intended to remain suspended like clouds in midair, but to soak the earth and to be drawn back toward God after completing its purpose. The Word of God is eternal Word without beginning or end. Today the Word of God is compared to seed that sprouts and brings forth new life. All of our life, entire creation is groaning in anticipation of being all we can become. God's spirit is infused within human beings where it brings forth divine fruits. The farmer is aware that he has to prepare the ground, weed it and water it to produce good fruit. We are invited to sow the seed of the Gospel with our lives. In the Gospel of today we have the parable of the sower. The farmer goes out to sow the seed and it is placed in varying types of soil. A person who hears the word of God and understands it reaps a rich and fruitful harvest. In the first reading Prophet Isaiah speaks of the power of the word of God. It is like the rain that comes to the earth to make it fertile and fruitful by germinating the seed for the sower and bread for the ones who eat, so also the word of God is meant to bear plentiful fruit in men's heart. It brings life and joy where there was only death and sorrow. In the second reading Paul refers to the fact that all humans and all creation suffer because of sin and he assures us that the present sufferings are nothing compared to future glory. Material creation though subject to corruption, will eventually share in the glorious freedom of the children of God. Let us take home with us today the fact that the conditions of the soil encountered by the sower are not necessarily in four different fields. Agricultural conditions in the Holy Land show that all four conditions may be found in one field. It is the same with each one of us. Sometimes we cannot take the word of God because our hearts are just too hard. Sometimes we are enslaved by the attractiveness of the world. Sometimes when the word of God is given to us we crushed by the situations which take us away from God. Sometimes when conditions are just right we permit the rain of God's word to bring forth the blossoms of our love. If the results have been less than satisfactory, it is because we have not matured fully enough to produce the supernatural yield of which Jesus spoke.

*"The seed sown among thorns is the one who hears the word but then the cares of the world and the lure of riches choke the word and it bears no fruit." (Matthew 13:22)*

Does the lure of riches and material goods

choke God out of your life? Are you so caught up in earthly activities that you have no time for God? Gratitude and generosity are virtues that we should strive to do on a daily basis. Every decision we make either takes us one step closer to God or one step further away. What we receive at Mass every Sunday should be shared with others all the other days of the week as well.

NATURE'S BEAUTY

Our responsorial psalm today is a beautiful song of the joy of the Earth, putting forth its bounty and rejoicing in its fruitfulness. We are filled with joy when we see images of the earth blooming. So many people describe their experience of God's presence in their appreciation of nature's beauty. This alone is good reason to protect the beauty and wholeness of nature. "You have visited the land and watered it, / greatly have you enriched it. / God's watercourses are filled; / you have prepared the grain" (Psalm 65:10). Sadly, we do many things to destroy nature, even though it belongs ultimately to God and to all people: "[A]ll creation is groaning in labor pains even until now" (Romans 8:22).

# SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"My word shall not return to me void, but shall do my will, achieving the end for which I sent it" (Isaiah 55:11). Nature and people rejoice at these words, for they not only describe the beauty and fruitfulness of nature's gifts, which "shout and sing for joy" (Psalm 65:14), but profess a profound truth. This truth is that God's word is living and effective; that is, it accomplishes what it says. When God speaks a word of comfort or correction, what is said is done in its fullness.

## THE SOWER SOWS THE SEED

Haven't we all wondered sometimes which kind of ground we are as the seed falls? Do we spring up with joy, but then whither because the word has not taken root in us? Are we so tied up in worry and concern for material wellbeing that the word is choked off in us with cares? Or are we the rich soil on which the word of God falls, bearing rich fruit in our lives and making the lives of others better? We are probably all of these at one time or another in our lives. As we concern ourselves with these thoughts, we can hope that we are or are becoming the rich soil of open souls, open to God's effective word in us. If we are devoted to God, we ask God for help to be the souls who are receptive to God's word every day.

There are those who "shall indeed hear but not understand . . . look but never see. Gross is the heart of this people" (Matthew 13:14-15). They shall not be converted and healed. But those who concern themselves with the things of God "see what you see" and "hear what you hear" (Matthew 13:16) and rejoice in God's wonderful gifts on this Earth. Blessed are those who are the good soil who hear the word of God and keep it


EL SEMBRADOR SEMBRÓ LA SEMILLA



#### ACTIVIDADES PARA CATÓLICOS

##### NIÑOS EN CASA

Padres, no olviden que USTEDES son los catequistas principales y más efectivos para sus hijos. Las clases de Catecismo son solo una pequeña parte de su formación en la fe y dado que no podemos tenerlas en este momento, depende completamente de ustedes a enseñarles sobre su fe cada día.

- Establezca un espacio de oración en su hogar. Coloque una tela y artículos religiosos sobre una mesa (Biblia, agua bendita, velas, etc.), tal vez agregue una almohada en el piso para arrodillarse. Pídale que escriban las intenciones de oración y las coloquen en un tazón o jarrón sobre la mesa para colocar las intenciones.
- Enséñales cómo pasar un tiempo tranquilo simplemente "prestando atención" a lo que Dios quiere que sepan en sus corazones. Enséñales a cerrar los ojos, callar, respirar profundamente y concentrarse en Dios. Programe varias veces para esto todos los días y haga esto con ellos.
- Aprenda la oración del Padre Nuestro o Ave María en latín u otro idioma.
- Escuche y canten canciones católicas.
- Recen el rosario juntos en familia después de cenar cada noche.
- Prepare comida para un vecino anciano y entréguela o haga otra cosa amable por él. (Asegúrese de mantener al menos 6 pies de distancia por seguridad y lávese las manos mientras prepara algo)
- Haga una "Letanía familiar de los santos" ...avírigua quién es el santo patrón de cada miembro de la familia y llámalos al final de todas las oraciones (San Francisco, ruega por nosotros ... San José, ruega por nosotros ... etc.)
- Oren juntos en la mañana, en el mediodía y en la noche ... el Padre Nuestro, Dios te salve María, Gloria. Termina con "Jesús confiamos en ti".
- Lea los pasajes de la Biblia para la misa diaria y haga que los busquen en una Biblia. Pueden encontrarlos en "USCCB.org" o en la aplicación "Laudate".
- Vea videos sobre el Evangelio para el próximo fin de semana en [www.pflaumweeklies.com/weekly-videos/](http://www.pflaumweeklies.com/weekly-videos/)
- Conéctese en línea y descubra quién es el Santo del Día, luego encuentre un video para niños sobre ellos en Youtube.
- Hay muchas ideas en [www.loyolapress.com/our-catholic-faith/family/catholic-kids](http://www.loyolapress.com/our-catholic-faith/family/catholic-kids)
- Busque fotos de personas en su familia celebrando su Bautismo, Primera Comunión o Confirmación.
- ¡Asegúrense que todos los días les digan cuánto los aman, y que Dios también los ama!
- Ayude a sus hijos a reconocer lo BUENO que Dios hace en nuestras vidas cada día. Ayúdelos a ver Su mano en TODAS las cosas ... incluso caminar afuera puede ayudar a ver la gloria de Dios revelada.



### Activities for Catholic Children at Home

Parents, don't forget that YOU are the primary and most effective catechists for your children. CCE classes are only a small part of their faith formation and since we cannot have them right now it is completely up to you to teach them about their faith each day.

- Set up a prayer space in your home. Place a nice cloth and religious items onto a table (Bible, holy water, candles, etc) maybe add a pillow on the floor for kneeling. Have them write prayer intentions down and place in a bowl or vase on the table for the intentions to be placed in.
- Spend quiet time just "paying attention" to what God wants them to know in their hearts. Teach them to close their eyes, be silent, breathe deeply and just focus on God. Schedule multiple times for this every day.
- Learn the Lord's Prayer or Hail Mary in Latin or another language.
- Listen to and sing Catholic songs.
- Pray the rosary together as a family after dinner each evening.
- Make food for an elderly neighbor and deliver it or do something else kind for them.
- Make a "Family Litany of Saints"...find out who the patron saint of each family member is and call on them at the end of all prayers (St. Francis, pray for us....St. Joseph, pray for us...etc.)
- Pray together morning, noon and night...the Our Father, One Hail Mary, Glory Be. End with "Jesus we trust in you."
- Read the Bible passages for daily mass and actually have them look them up in a Bible. You can find these at "USCCB.org" or on the "Laudate" app.
- Watch videos regarding the Gospel for the coming weekend at [www.pflaumweeklies.com/weekly-videos/](http://www.pflaumweeklies.com/weekly-videos/)
- Go online and figure out who the Saint of the Day is then find a children's video about them on Youtube.

- Look for photos of people in your family celebrating their Baptism, First Holy Communion or Confirmation.
- Make sure they hear you say, every day, how much you love them and that God loves them too!
- Help your children recognize the GOOD that God does in our lives each day. Help them see His hand in ALL things...even a walk outside can help us see God's glory revealed.

## SAINT OF THE DAY

### Saturday, July 11 ~ Saint Benedict

Saint Benedict is known as the Father of Western Monasticism due to his great influence on the shape and character of monastic life in the West. Living the life of a hermit, others witnessed his lifestyle and wanted to follow. He eventually organized these men and wrote a Rule governing their communal life. Noted for its moderation and hospitality, the Rule continues to nurture the Cistercians as well as the Benedictines of today.

### Monday, July 13 ~ Saint Henry

Saint Henry, a German king and Holy Roman Emperor, lived life according to the customs of his times, but did it in a holy way. He is a clear witness to the holiness of secular life lived according to the gospel norms.

### Tuesday, July 14 ~ Saint Kateri Tekakwitha

Known as the Lily of the Mohawks, Saint Kateri Tekakwitha's story is one of courage and humility. Courageously facing her uncle's dislike for anything Christian, she converted to Catholicism at age 19. This led to a life of extreme penance and austerity for the young woman. Escaping to Montreal, Kateri continued to live a life of prayer and penance.

### Wednesday, July 15 ~ Saint Bonaventure

Saint Bonaventure was in many ways the second founder of the Franciscan Order. Through his teaching, writing, and mysticism, Saint Bonaventure captured the spirit of Saint Francis and renewed the order accordingly. Saint Bonaventure served as the Minister General of the Franciscans and served the Church as the Cardinal Bishop of Albano.

### Thursday, July 16 ~ Our Lady of Mount Carmel

The Blessed Virgin has many, many titles. Today we celebrate one of them—Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Mount Carmel is in northern Israel and has long been the site of a group of religious monks. The entire Church celebrates this feast along with the Carmelite Monks and Nuns.

## SANTO DEL DIA

### Sábado, 11 de Julio ~ S. Benito

Fundador de la orden benedictina, patrono de Europa: su vida se refleja fielmente en la "Regla", cuyo espíritu se resume en el lema "Ora et Labora". En estas palabras San Benito, cuya memoria es celebrada por la Iglesia el 11 de julio, indica a los monjes los pasos a seguir en su camino.

### Lunes, 13 de Julio ~ S. Enrique II

Emperador del Sacro Imperio Romano y último exponente de la dinastía de los Otones, Enrico II vive a caballo del año mil (973-1024). Dedica su vida a reforzar el destino de la Iglesia junto a aquel de su reino. Es considerado ejemplo de rectitud en el gobierno y es patrono de los monarcas.

### Martes, 14 de Julio ~ Santa Kateri Tekakwitha

Conocida como la Lirio de los Mohawks, la historia de Santa Kateri Tekakwitha es de valor y humildad. Valientemente, ante de su tío que le disgustaba todo lo cristiano, se convirtió al catolicismo a los 19 años. Esto llevó a una vida de extrema penitencia y austeridad para la joven. Al escapar a Montreal, Kateri continuó viviendo una vida de oración y penitencia.

### Miércoles, 15 de Julio ~ S. Buenaventura

Conocido como el "segundo fundador de la Orden" de los Hermanos Menores, San Buenaventura, distinguido teólogo y Doctor de la Iglesia, transforma la tradición franciscana en una escuela de pensamiento. Murió en 1274, durante el Concilio de Lyon y fue canonizado en 1482.

### Jueves, 15 de Julio ~ Nuestra Señora del Monte Carmelo

La Santísima Virgen tiene muchos, muchos títulos. Hoy celebramos una de ellas: Nuestra Señora del Monte Carmelo. El Monte Carmelo se encuentra en el norte de Israel y ha sido durante mucho tiempo el sitio de un grupo de monjes religiosos. Toda la Iglesia celebra esta fiesta junto con los monjes y monjas carmelitas.
