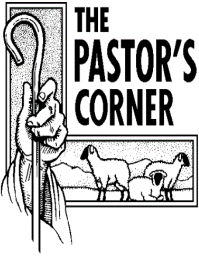

## **Pentecost Sunday -John 20:19-23**

Today, we are celebrating Pentecost Sunday, the day when the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples and the church was founded. The spirit came upon the timid disciples in the form of tongues of fire and transformed them into true messengers of Jesus. Once they received the Spirit they went out boldly and preached to all in Jerusalem and elsewhere. On this day Jesus wants us to know the freedom of living in his Spirit. This feast is the culmination of the Paschal mystery where Jesus fulfils his promise of sending the Spirit of the Father and the Son on his disciples. This feast also indicates that the Holy Spirit is an on-going reality, who will be with the church forever and who will touch our lives every single day. We celebrate this day to recognize the gift of the Holy Spirit realizing that God's very life, breath and energy lives in all believers. The celebration tells us that the same Spirit is given to each one of us, that we are all baptized by one Spirit into one body and that the Spirit which raised Jesus from the dead will raise us too. All the three readings make reference to the arrival of the Holy Spirit being baptized in the Spirit and being sent forth to proclaim the Word of God so others may convert to the living faith. The first reading gives a graphic picture of Pentecost with the Spirit descending on the disciples in the form of tongues of fire and leads them to speak in many languages as they speak about Jesus. All are amazed at their teaching. The Gospel tells us of the happenings immediately after the Resurrection. Jesus suddenly appears to the disciples, gives them peace and gives them the Holy Spirit. With this they get the power to forgive sins of people and reconcile them. In the second reading Paul says that there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit and through the spirit we have become one body in Christ.

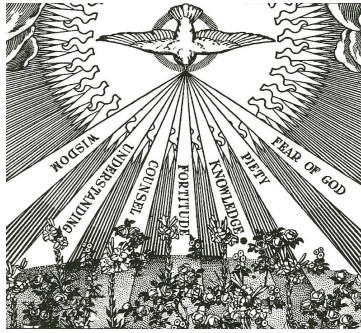

# Pentecost

Jesus breathed on them and said to them,  
“Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them,  
and whose sins you retain are retained.”

John 20:22-23

### THE SPIRIT MOVES US

Today we celebrate Pentecost, the day when the Holy Spirit was given by Jesus and received by the disciples. The readings from Acts and the Gospel of John offer accounts of that day while First Corinthians offers an analysis of the many gifts that resulted from the infusion of the Holy Spirit. The psalm and the sequence read today are filled with praise for the work of the Spirit. Today represents a culmination of all the difficult days that have gone before, the triumph of Holy Thursday, the death and despair of the Cross, the astonishing Resurrection, and the appearances of a familiar but transformed Jesus to his disciples. It represents the pivotal transition for the disciples from people of uncertainty and fear to people of commitment and action. The Spirit moves the disciples and moves us as well.

### SAFETY IN NUMBERS

The apostles and all the believers in Jesus have been through a tumultuous time. They have experienced the heights of Holy Thursday and the depths of Good Friday, the uncertainties of Easter Sunday, and the multiple appearances of Jesus after his death and resurrection. They have not recognized Jesus, and when they have, they have demanded reassurance from him. Throughout most of this time they have stayed together. Acts describes them all in one place, together, when wind fills the house and tongues of fire rest on each of them. They then find themselves able to communicate with and be understood by those who had not understood them. Everyone recognizes this as a mighty act of God. John reminds us and the disciples that receiving the Spirit brings with it peace and the need for action. They receive the Spirit so they can be sent into the world to forgive sins.

### ACTION IN THE SPIRIT

When our world has been turned upside down, when we are faced with uncertainties about what is real, when we are unsure about what lies ahead for us, when we don't know what we should do next, we do not want to be alone. Neither did the apostles and all those who loved Jesus. They wanted to be together when they needed to make sense of what was happening to them and what was going to be asked of them. There is safety in numbers but neither the apostles nor we can remain huddled together. The Spirit requires that we act. All the manifestations of the Spirit are given in order to benefit us and our world. The many different gifts given by the Spirit demand that we do many kinds of work, many forms of service. But we do not work alone. The Spirit is always with us.

# DOMINGO DE *Pentecostés*

31 DE MAYO DE 2020

Juan 20:22-23

## EL ESPÍRITU NOS MUEVE

Hoy celebramos Pentecostés, el día en que el Espíritu Santo fue dado por Jesús y recibido por los discípulos. Las lecturas de Hechos y el Evangelio de Juan ofrecen relatos de aquel día, mientras que First Corinthians ofrece un análisis de los muchos dones que resultaron de la infusión del Espíritu Santo. El salmo y la secuencia leída hoy están llenos de alabanza por la obra del Espíritu. Hoy representa la culminación de todos los días difíciles que han pasado antes, el triunfo del Jueves Santo, la muerte y la desesperación de la Cruz, la asombrosa resurrección y las apariciones de un Jesús familiar pero transformado a sus discípulos. Representa la transición fundamental para los discípulos de las personas de incertidumbre y miedo a las personas de compromiso y acción. El Espíritu mueve a los discípulos y también nos mueve.

## SEGURIDAD EN LOS NÚMEROS

A los apóstoles y a todos los creyentes en Jesús les han tocado tiempos difíciles. Pasaron por la crisis del Jueves Santo y tocaron fondo el Viernes Santo, la incertidumbre del Domingo de Pascua, y las varias apariciones de Jesús después de su muerte y resurrección. Ellos no habían reconocido a Jesús y cuando lo hicieron le preguntaron si de verdad era él. Durante todo este tiempo ellos permanecieron juntos. El libro de los Hechos los pone a todos en un lugar, juntos, cuando el viento sopla y llena la casa de lenguas de fuego que se posan sobre ellos. Así ya ellos pueden comunicarse y los entienden por quienes no los habían entendido. Cada uno reconoce que esto es un milagro de Dios. Juan nos recuerda y los discípulos que recibieron el Espíritu trae paz y la necesidad de la acción. Ellos recibieron el Espíritu para que puedan ser enviados al mundo a perdonar los pecados.

## ACCIÓN EN EL ESPÍRITU

Cuando nuestro mundo se pone de cabeza, cuando enfrentamos incertidumbre acerca de lo que es real, cuando estamos inseguros de nuestro porvenir, cuando no sabemos lo siguiente que debemos hacer, no queremos estar solos. Tampoco los discípulos y todos aquellos que amaron a Jesús. Ellos quisieron estar unidos cuando necesitaron darse cuenta de lo que les estaba pasando y de lo que se les iba a pedir. Hay seguridad en los números, pero ni los apóstoles ni nosotros podemos permanecer juntos. El Espíritu requiere que vayamos a la acción. Todas las manifestaciones del Espíritu se dan para que nos beneficien a nosotros y al mundo. Los diferentes dones dados por el Espíritu requieren que realicemos diferentes obras, muchas formas de servicio. Pero no trabajamos solos. El Espíritu siempre está con nosotros.

### Oración en familia

Querido Jesús, ayúdanos a reconocer cuándo tomamos malas decisiones y a buscar siempre tu perdón. Amén.

Parents, don't forget that YOU are the primary and most effective catechists for your children. CCE classes are only a small part of their faith formation and since we cannot have them right now it is completely up to you to teach them about their faith each day.

- Set up a prayer space in your home. Place a nice cloth and religious items onto a table (Bible, holy water, candles, etc) maybe add a pillow on the floor for kneeling. Have them write prayer intentions down and place in a bowl or vase on the table for the intentions to be placed in.
- Spend quiet time just "paying attention" to what God wants them to know in their hearts. Teach them to close their eyes, be silent, breathe deeply and just focus on God. Schedule multiple times for this every day.
- Learn the Lord's Prayer or Hail Mary in Latin or another language.
- Listen to and sing Catholic songs.
- Pray the rosary together as a family after dinner each evening.
- Make food for an elderly neighbor and deliver it or do something else kind for them.
- Make a "Family Litany of Saints"...find out who the patron saint of each family member is and call on them at the end of all prayers (St. Francis, pray for us...St. Joseph, pray for us...etc.)
- Pray together morning, noon and night...the Our Father, One Hail Mary, Glory Be. End with "Jesus we trust in you."
- Read the Bible passages for daily mass and actually have them look them up in a Bible. You can find these at "USCCB.org" or on the "Laudate" app.
- Watch videos regarding the Gospel for the coming weekend at [www.pflaumweeklies.com/weekly-videos/](http://www.pflaumweeklies.com/weekly-videos/)
- Go online and figure out who the Saint of the Day is then find a children's video about them on Youtube.
- There are lots of ideas at [www.loyolapress.com/our-catholic-faith/family/catholic-kids](http://www.loyolapress.com/our-catholic-faith/family/catholic-kids)
- Look for photos of people in your family celebrating their Baptism, First Holy Communion or Confirmation.
- Make sure they hear you say, every day, how much you love them and that God loves them too!
- Help your children recognize the GOOD that God does in our lives each day. Help them see His hand in ALL things...even a walk outside can help us see God's glory revealed.



## ACTIVIDADES PARA CATÓLICOS NIÑOS EN CASA

Padres, no olviden que USTEDES son los catequistas principales y más efectivos para sus hijos. Las clases de Catecismo son solo una pequeña parte de su formación en la fe y dado que no podemos tenerlas en este momento, depende completamente de ustedes a enseñarles sobre su fe cada día.

- Establezca un espacio de oración en su hogar. Coloque una tela y artículos religiosos sobre una mesa (Biblia, agua bendita, velas, etc.), tal vez agregue una almohada en el piso para arrodillarse. Pídeles que escriban las intenciones de oración y las coloquen en un tazón o jarrón sobre la mesa para colocar las intenciones.
- Enséñeles cómo pasar un tiempo tranquilo simplemente "prestando atención" a lo que Dios quiere que sepan en sus corazones. Enséñeles a cerrar los ojos, callar, respirar profundamente y concentrarse en Dios. Programe varias veces para esto todos los días y haga esto con ellos.
- Aprenda la oración del Padre Nuestro o Ave María en latín u otro idioma.
- Escuche y canten canciones católicas.
- Recen el rosario juntos en familia después de cenar cada noche.
- Prepare comida para un vecino anciano y entréguela o haga otra cosa amable por él. (Asegúrese de mantener al menos 6 pies de distancia por seguridad y lávese las manos mientras prepara algo)
- Haga una "Letanía familiar de los santos" ... averigua quién es el santo patrón de cada miembro de la familia y llámalos al final de todas las oraciones (San Francisco, ruega por nosotros ... San José, ruega por nosotros ... etc.)
- Oren juntos en la mañana, en el mediodía y en la noche ... el Padre Nuestro, Dios te salve María, Gloria. Termina con "Jesús confiamos en ti".
- Lea los pasajes de la Biblia para la misa diaria y haga que los busquen en una Biblia. Pueden encontrarlos en "USCCB.org" o en la aplicación "Laudate".
- Ve videos sobre el Evangelio para el próximo fin de semana en [www.pflaumweeklies.com/weekly-videos/](http://www.pflaumweeklies.com/weekly-videos/)
- Conéctese en línea y descubra quién es el Santo del Día, luego encuentre un video para niños sobre ellos en Youtube.

- Busque fotos de personas en su familia celebrando su Bautismo, Primera Comunión o Confirmación.

- Ayude a sus hijos a reconocer lo BUENO que Dios hace en nuestras vidas cada día. Ayúdelos a ver Su mano en TODAS las cosas ... incluso caminar afuera puede ayudar a ver la gloria de Dios revelada.
