Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

John 20:1-9

In the Easter Gospel we hear about how the disciples found the tomb empty three days after Jesus' death. We are also told that they do not yet understand the Scriptures or that Jesus had been raised from the dead.

That understanding gradually unfolded for the disciples as they began to experience the risen Lord. Similarly, our understanding of Jesus' Resurrection unfolds for us throughout our lives. In the weeks ahead, we will hear how the first disciples moved from confusion, doubt, and skepticism to faith. Their experience can teach us how we too might receive this gift of faith from God.

READ TOGETHER

Today's Gospel, John 20:1-9.

TALK TOGETHER

Gather your family members and ask them to share what they know about the events that happened in the days after Jesus' crucifixion. Invite your family to imagine that they are among Jesus' first disciples. Reflect together on the Gospel with questions such as these: If you had been among the first disciples who heard that the stone had been removed from Jesus' tomb and that Jesus' body was no longer there, what would you think? What did Mary of Magdala, Simon Peter, and the disciple whom Jesus loved think had happened? Recall that this experience is the first indication Jesus' disciples have that he is risen. Throughout the Easter season, we will learn more about how the disciples came to believe that Jesus had been raised from the dead.

Pray together

Today's psalm, Psalm 118: "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad."



Domingo de Pascua de la Resurrección del Señor

Juan 20:1-9

En el Evangelio de Pascua escuchamos cómo los discípulos encontraron el sepulcro vacío tres días después de la muerte de Jesús. También se nos dice que todavía no entendían las Escrituras o que Jesús había resucitado de entre los muertos.

Ese entendimiento se desarrolló gradualmente para los discípulos cuando comenzaron a experimentar a el Señor resucitado. De manera similar, nuestra comprensión de la Resurrección de Jesús se desarrolla para nosotros a lo largo de nuestras vidas. En las próximas semanas, escucharemos cómo los primeros discípulos pasaron de la confusión, la duda y el escepticismo a la fe. Su experiencia puede enseñarnos cómo nosotros también podemos recibir este don de la fe de Dios.

LEER JUNTOS

Evangelio de hoy, Juan 20:1-9.

HABLE JUNTOS

Reúna a los miembros de su familia y pídeles que compartan lo que saben sobre los eventos que sucedieron en los días posteriores a la crucifixión de Jesús. Invita a su familia a imaginar que se encuentran entre los primeros discípulos de Jesús. Reflexionen juntos sobre el Evangelio con preguntas como estas: Si hubieras estado entre los primeros discípulos que oyeron que habían quitado la piedra del sepulcro de Jesús y que el cuerpo de Jesús ya no estaba allí, ¿qué pensaríais? ¿Qué pensaron María Magdalena, Simón Pedro y el discípulo a quien Jesús amaba que había sucedido? Recordemos que esta experiencia es el primer indicio que tienen los discípulos de Jesús de que él ha resucitado. A lo largo de la temporada de Pascua, aprenderemos más acerca de cómo los discípulos llegaron a creer que Jesús había resucitado de entre los muertos.

Orar juntos

Salmo 117: "Este es el día del triunfo del Señor."

"...He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him."

(ACTS 10:38)

We can't give what we don't have. Open your heart to receive God's love, mercy and forgiveness. Then, show the same to others. 

EASTER

The Easter Vigil is the "Mother of All Vigils. "Easter Sunday, then, is the greatest of all Sundays, and Easter Time is the most important of all liturgical times. Easter is the celebration of the Lord's resurrection from the dead, culminating in his Ascension to the Father and sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. There are 50 days of Easter from the first Sunday to Pentecost. It is characterized, above all, by the joy of glorified life and the victory over death, expressed most fully in the great resounding cry of the Christian: Alleluia! All faith flows from faith in the resurrection: "If Christ has not been raised, then empty is our preaching; empty, too, is your faith." (1 Cor 15:14) "What you sow is not brought to life unless it dies. And what you sow is not the body that is to be, but a bare kernel of wheat, perhaps, or of some other kind;...So also is the resurrection of the dead. It is sown corruptible; it is raised incorruptible. It is sown dishonorable; it is raised glorious. It is sown weak; it is raised powerful. It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual one. So, too, it is written, "The first man, Adam, became a living being," the last Adam a life-giving spirit. But the spiritual was not first; rather the natural and then the spiritual. The first man was from the earth, earthly; the second man, from heaven. As was the earthly one, so also are the earthly, and as is the heavenly one, so also are the heavenly. Just as we have borne the image of the earthly one, we shall also bear the image of the heavenly one (1 Cor 15:36-37, 42-49).

The octave of Easter comprises the eight days which stretch from the first to the second Sunday. It is a way of prolonging the joy of the initial day. In a sense, every day of the Octave is like a little Sunday. The word "Easter" comes from Old English, meaning simply the "East." The sun which rises in the East, bringing light, warmth and hope, is a symbol for the Christian of the rising Christ, who is the true Light of the world. The Paschal Candle is a central symbol of this divine light, which is Christ. It is kept near the ambo throughout Easter Time, and lit for all liturgical celebrations.




VISITING OUR PARISH?
