**Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord ~ Year A
John 20:1-9**

In the Easter Gospel we hear about how the disciples found the tomb empty three days after Jesus' death. We are also told that they do not yet understand the Scriptures or that Jesus had been raised from the dead. That understanding gradually unfolded for the disciples as they began to experience the risen Lord. Similarly, our understanding of Jesus' Resurrection unfolds for us throughout our lives. In the weeks ahead, we will hear how the first disciples moved from confusion, doubt, and skepticism to faith. Their experience can teach us how we too might receive this gift of faith from God.

TALK TOGETHER

Gather your family members and ask them to share what they know about the events that happened in the days after Jesus' crucifixion. Invite your family to imagine that they are among Jesus' first disciples. Reflect together on the Gospel with questions such as these: If you had been among the first disciples who heard that the stone had been removed from Jesus' tomb and that Jesus' body was no longer there, what would you think? What did Mary of Magdala, Simon Peter, and the disciple whom Jesus loved think had happened? Recall that this experience is the first indication Jesus' disciples have that he is risen. Throughout the Easter season, we will learn more about how the disciples came to believe that Jesus had been raised from the dead.

READ TOGETHER

Read together today's Gospel, John 20:1-9.

PRAY TOGETHER

Pray together using today's psalm, Psalm 118: "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad".



Pastor's Family Corner

**Domingo de Pascua de la Resurrección del Señor ~ Año A
Juan 20:1-9**

En el Evangelio de Pascua escuchamos cómo los discípulos encontraron la tumba vacía tres días después de la muerte de Jesús. También se nos dice que todavía no entienden las Escrituras ni que Jesús había resucitado de entre los muertos. Ese entendimiento se fue desarrollando gradualmente para los discípulos a medida que comenzaron a experimentar al Señor resucitado. De manera similar, nuestra comprensión de la Resurrección de Jesús se desarrolla para nosotros a lo largo de nuestra vida. En las próximas semanas, escucharemos cómo los primeros discípulos pasaron de la confusión, la duda y el escepticismo a la fe. Su experiencia puede enseñarnos cómo también nosotros podemos recibir este don de la fe de parte de Dios.

HABLEN JUNTOS

Reúne a los miembros de tu familia y pídeles que compartan lo que saben sobre los eventos que ocurrieron en los días posteriores a la crucifixión de Jesús. Invita a tu familia a imaginar que están entre los primeros discípulos de Jesús. Reflexionen juntos sobre el Evangelio con preguntas como estas: Si hubieras estado entre los primeros discípulos que escucharon que la piedra había sido removida del sepulcro de Jesús y que el cuerpo de Jesús ya no estaba allí, ¿qué pensarías? ¿Qué pensaron María de Magdala, Simón Pedro y el discípulo a quien Jesús amaba que había sucedido? Recuerda que esta experiencia es la primera indicación que los discípulos de Jesús tienen de que él ha resucitado. A lo largo de la temporada de Pascua, aprenderemos más sobre cómo los discípulos llegaron a creer que Jesús había resucitado de entre los muertos.

LEER JUNTOS

Lean juntos el Evangelio de hoy, Juan 20:1-9.

ORAR JUNTOS

Oren juntos utilizando el salmo de hoy, Salmo 118: "Este es el día que hizo el Señor; regocijémonos y alegrémonos".

"Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth." Colossians 3:2

Do you put God first in all things? Possessions, money, power, ego can easily become gods to many of us. Do a quick check of what is important to you. Is God at the very top of the list? If not, your priorities need to be re-adjusted. Don't let earthly things become a god before God. This is also the first commandment - I am the Lord your God, you shall not have any strange gods before me.

EASTER

The Easter Vigil is the "Mother of All Vigils." Easter Sunday, then, is the greatest of all Sundays, and Easter Time is the most important of all liturgical times. Easter is the celebration of the **Lord's resurrection** from the dead, culminating in his Ascension to the Father and sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. There are **50 days** of Easter from the first Sunday to Pentecost. It is characterized, above all, by the joy of glorified life and the victory over death, expressed most fully in the great resounding cry of the Christian: Alleluia! All faith flows from faith in the resurrection: "If Christ has not been raised, then empty is our preaching; empty, too, is your faith." (1 Cor 15:14)

"What you sow is not brought to life unless it dies. And what you sow is not the body that is to be, but a bare kernel of wheat, perhaps, or of some other kind;...So also is the resurrection of the dead. It is sown corruptible; it is raised incorruptible. It is sown dishonorable; it is raised glorious. It is sown weak; it is raised powerful. It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual one. So, too, it is written, "The first man, Adam, became a living being," the last Adam a life-giving spirit. But the spiritual was not first; rather the natural and then the spiritual. The first man was from the earth, earthly; the second man, from heaven. As was the earthly one, so also are the earthly, and as is the heavenly one, so also are the heavenly. Just as we have borne the image of the earthly one, we shall also bear the image of the heavenly one (1 Cor 15:36-37, 42-49).

The octave of Easter comprises the eight days which stretch from the first to the second Sunday. It is a way of prolonging the joy of the initial day. In a sense, every day of the Octave is like a little Sunday. The word "Easter" comes from Old English, meaning simply the "East." The sun which rises in the East, bringing light, warmth and hope, is a symbol for the Christian of the rising Christ, who is the true Light of the world. **The Paschal Candle** is a central symbol of this divine light, which is Christ. It is kept near the ambo throughout Easter Time, and lit for all liturgical celebrations.



PASCUA

La Vigilia Pascual es la "Madre de todas las Vigilias". El Domingo de Resurrección, entonces, es el más grande de todos los domingos, y el Tiempo Pascual es el más importante de todos los tiempos litúrgicos. La Pascua es la celebración **de la resurrección del Señor** de entre los muertos, que culmina con su Ascensión al Padre y el envío del Espíritu Santo sobre la Iglesia. Hay **50 días** de Pascua desde el primer domingo hasta Pentecostés. Se caracteriza, sobre todo, por la alegría de la vida glorificada y de la victoria sobre la muerte, expresada más plenamente en el gran grito resonante del cristiano: ¡Aleluya! Toda fe brota de la fe en la resurrección: "Si Cristo no ha resucitado,

entonces vacía es nuestra predicación; vacía también vuestra fe". (1 Corintios 15:14)

"Lo que sembráis, no resucita a menos que muera. Y lo que sembráis no es el cuerpo que ha de ser, sino un grano desnudo de trigo, tal vez, o de alguna otra clase;...Así también es la resurrección de los muertos. Se siembra corruptible; resucitará incorruptible. Se siembra deshonoroso; resucitará glorioso. Se siembra débil; resucitará poderoso. Se siembra cuerpo natural; resucitará cuerpo espiritual. Si hay un cuerpo natural cuerpo, también hay uno espiritual. Así también está escrito: "Se hizo el primer hombre, Adán, ser viviente", el último Adán, espíritu vivificante. Pero no fue primero lo espiritual, sino lo natural y luego el espiritual. El primer hombre era de la tierra, terrenal; el segundo hombre, del cielo. Como era el terrenal, así también son los terrenales, y como es el celestial, así también son los celestiales. Así como tenemos llevado la imagen del terrenal, también llevaremos la imagen del celestial (1 Co 15:36-37, 42-49).

La octava de Pascua abarca los ocho días que se extienden del primer al segundo domingo. Es una forma de prolongar la alegría del día inicial. En cierto sentido, cada día de la Octava es como un pequeño domingo. La palabra "Pascua" proviene del inglés antiguo y significa simplemente "Oriente". El sol que sale por Oriente, trayendo luz, calor y esperanza, es para el cristiano un símbolo de Cristo naciente, que es la verdadera Luz del mundo. **El Cirio Pascual** es un símbolo central de esta luz divina que es Cristo. Se mantiene cerca de ambos durante el tiempo pascual y se enciende para todas las celebraciones litúrgicas.
