



5th Sunday In Ordinary Time- Matthew 5:13-16

Today's Readings place an emphasis on Christian faith and call every Christian to be the shining light in the world. In Matthew's Gospel everyone is called by Jesus to be salt and light for others, for the world. Our lives, what we do and the way we do things, should be a source of light and meaning for others. Our actions should be a visible sign for others of God's presence in the world. A Christian has to be outstanding before everyone through his deeds and must enlighten all. In the Old testament God had been telling His chosen people through Prophet Isaiah that He would send a Light in the world to save His people and the gentiles. In the First Reading of today Prophet Isaiah asks the people of Israel to be the shining light to all the people. They who had returned from the Babylonian exile they would be like the light. However the prophet tells them that they would be light if they free the oppressed, share their bread with the hungry and shelter the homeless poor. The responsorial psalm corroborates with this saying that a just person is a light in darkness to the upright. St. Paul's theme is slightly different; for him Christianity is not merely a doctrine or theory on life, but the person of Jesus Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit in people's lives. Paul realized that we can draw the world to the love of God by making our actions presentable and active before people. Therefore, there is a strong spiritual link between the power of God and our good works. For him Christ crucified was the heart of his message.

"For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." (Matthew 5:20)

The scribes and Pharisees lived according to the letter of the law, and they used this to elevate themselves above the other people. Jesus is clear - it's the love that you have in your heart that will get you to heaven. Simply following church rules out of obligation, not love, does not put you on the path to heaven. Attending Mass on Sunday and then gossiping about a fellow parishioner on the parking lot is an example of a modern day Pharisee.



Tuesday, February 11th is the Memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes, commemorating the 18 apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary to Saint Bernadette which occurred between February 11th and July 16th of 1858 near the town of Lourdes in the Hautes-Pyrenees region of France. Though there would be other people with her, only Saint Bernadette could see Our Lady.

During the 9th appearance, on February 25th, Our Lady told Bernadette to drink from a spring that suddenly appeared in the grotto where the apparitions occurred. During the 12th appearance, on March 1st, a visitor washed her arm in water from the spring, and some nerve damage in it was immediately cured. There is a tradition of miraculous cures at the grotto, or received by those who drink or are bathed in its waters. Bernadette later said that she believed the water had no special properties, but that it helped focus the faithful who received the cures through faith and prayer.

During the 13th appearance, on March 2nd, Our Lady told Bernadette to tell local priests that they should build a chapel at the grotto, and have processions to be made to it. The priests were understandably skeptical, but due to the numbers of pilgrims coming to the area, construction of several churches was started within a few years. During the 16th appearance, on March 25th, Our Lady identified herself as "The Immaculate Conception".

Millions of people make a pilgrimage to this holy site every year and many miracles have been reported to have occurred there.

Quinceañera

The young lady's family must be registered, participating members of the parish for at least 1 year. "Participating members" are those who faithfully attend Mass and support the Church financially (using their contribution envelopes proving such). Ideally, they should also be active in the ministry, volunteering in the Church.

The young lady must attend CCE classes faithfully for at least 1 YEAR PRIOR to the Quinceañera. She must have received the sacrament of Baptism and she must make her First Holy Communion BEFORE the Quinceañera. She must be faithfully attending Confirmation preparation classes. She, along with her Sponsor, must attend all Quinceañera preparation classes.

Please call office at least 1 YEAR BEFORE any other arrangements are made and DO NOT set a final date for the Quinceañera prior to your interview with the priest.

Quinceañera classes are held ONCE per year.
