

Second Sunday of Lent -Matthew 17:1-9

Today's readings speak of our call to holiness of true greatness, of faith and trust in God and the ultimate glory that awaits us. We encounter a God who speaks to us and we are called upon to listen to him and respond to him. Now as we enter the Second Week of Lent our task is to continue to examine our hearts and to repent in order to prepare ourselves for the glorious paschal mystery. As human beings we do not like change. We do not like change and we resist it as much as we can. But as much as we resist, change is a part of our life. We grow from infant to child to adult. We move from one place to another in search of new things and new way of living. We know that we are pilgrims on a journey to a more permanent dwelling place a place of total union with our God of Truth and Love. In this context the First Reading from the Book of Genesis tells us of the Divine calling of Abraham to become the spiritual father of the people of God. He shows faith in God's word which will lead him to many blessings. He trusts God who has called him and moves to the unknown destination and is made the Father of a nation. The Gospel of today speaks of striking interventions by God in people's lives indicated through the transfiguration of Jesus on the Mountain. Jesus is transfigured in the presence of his disciples, manifesting to them his divinity to strengthen them in their faith before he enters into his Passion and death on the cross. In the second reading Paul encourages Timothy to persevere in his efforts for the Gospel. He can depend on God's help because of the grace bestowed on him by Jesus. Today as we listen to his Word the Father still speaks to us and tells us that Jesus is his beloved son and we ought to listen to him for he has the words of eternal life. For the disciples unknown to them the glory of Jesus transfiguration was preparing them to accept the scandal of the cross. They would understand this only later with the resurrection. Today let us look beyond the pain of life and see the presence of God in our world and the gift of life that God makes to each of us. Let us listen to him intently and put his words into practice.

"Go forth from the land of your kinsfolk and from your father's house to a land that I will show you." (Genesis 12:1)

God calls all of us to leave behind our old ways and to follow Him, placing our complete trust in Him. Some of the old ways that we may have to struggle to leave behind might be materialism, selfishness, and greed. Yet God promises to show us a new land and a better way to live. Remember what St. Teresa of Calcutta said, "God does not call us to be successful, God calls us to be faithful."


Medidas de Precaución: Enfermedad por Coronavirus (COVID-19)

También les recordamos a todas las personas que están enfermas que no tienen la obligación de estar presentes para la Misa Dominical. A los que asistan a las asambleas litúrgicas se les pide que respeten que algunos pueden sentirse incómodos con el contacto físico durante los momentos de la Misa, como el Padre Nuestro o el Signo de paz. Continuemos orando por todos aquellos en nuestras comunidades y en todo el mundo que han muerto y por aquellos que están enfermos y sufriendo.

Precautionary Measures - Coronavirus Illness (COVID-19)

In response to concerns expressed by the faithful regarding the potential spread of the coronavirus illness (COVID-19) into our communities, the Diocese of Beaumont is recommending common sense steps and precautions in regards to celebration of the liturgy. Until further notice, Diocese of Beaumont parishes will suspend the distribution of Holy Communion from the Chalice and distribute Holy Communion only under the form of the Host to help minimize any risk for the members of the liturgical assembly who are present for the reception of the Holy Eucharist. We are also reminding all persons who are ill they are under no obligation to be present for Sunday Mass. Those attending liturgical assemblies are asked to respect that some may be uncomfortable with physical contact during times of the Mass, such as the Lord's Prayer or the Sign of Peace. Please continue to pray for those in our communities and around the world who have died and for those who are sick and suffering.

We have 16 families from St. Joseph and 14 families from St. Anne who have already pledged to this year's Bishop's Faith Appeal. If you have not yet made a financial pledge nor one of prayer, Father asks that you prayerfully consider doing so. Financial Pledge Envelopes and Spiritual Pledge/Intention Cards are available in the pews and in the parish office.



HOLY THURSDAY




Celebrates the Last Supper with the disciples and Passover.
