**Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, Matthew 26:14–27:66**

Palm, or Passion, Sunday begins the most sacred week of the Church year—Holy Week. During these days, we prepare ourselves for Easter by prayerful reflection upon the events of Jesus' Passion and death. You might display a crucifix in a prominent place this week, as reminder of the salvation Christ won for us. The crucifix can also be the focal point for family prayer during Holy Week.

Because of the length and complexity of the Passion narrative, young children have difficulty remaining attentive when it is proclaimed in its entirety. Families can choose to read a portion of this Sunday's Gospel each day of Holy Week, providing ample opportunity for children to ask questions and respond to the events described there. In this way, the entire week can become a "way of the cross."

Each day during Holy Week, the family can gather in a prayerful space with a crucifix as the focal point. The Passion as found in Matthew's Gospel might be read as follows throughout the week:

- Sunday: Matthew 21:1-11  
(Gospel at the Procession with Palms)
- Monday: Matthew 26:14 - 25
- Tuesday: Matthew 26:26 - 35
- Wednesday: Matthew 26:36 - 56
- Thursday: Matthew 26:57 - 27:14
- Friday: Matthew 27:15-54

After reading from the Gospel each night, the family might reflect on the reading together. Conclude your prayer time together by praying the Lord's Prayer and/or singing an appropriate hymn, such as "Jesus, Jesus," "Were You There?" or "What Wondrous Love Is This."



**Pastor's Family Corner**

**Domingo de Ramos de La Pasión del Señor Mateo 26:14–27:66**

El Domingo de Ramos, o de la Pasión, comienza la semana más sagrada del año litúrgico: la Semana Santa. Durante estos días, nos preparamos para la Pascua mediante la reflexión piadosa sobre los acontecimientos de la Pasión y muerte de Jesús. Podrías colocar un crucifijo en un lugar prominente esta semana, como recordatorio de la salvación que Cristo ganó para nosotros. El crucifijo también puede ser el punto focal para la oración familiar durante la Semana Santa.

Debido a la longitud y complejidad del relato de la Pasión, a los niños pequeños les resulta difícil mantenerse atentos cuando se proclama en su totalidad. Las familias pueden elegir leer una parte del Evangelio de este domingo cada día de la Semana Santa, proporcionando así muchas oportunidades para que los niños hagan preguntas y respondan a los eventos allí descritos. De esta manera, toda la semana puede convertirse en un "camino de la cruz".

Cada día durante la Semana Santa, la familia puede reunirse en un espacio de oración con un crucifijo como punto central. La Pasión según se encuentra en el Evangelio de Mateo podría leerse de la siguiente manera a lo largo de la semana:

- Domingo: Mateo 21:1-11  
(Evangelio de la Procesión con Palmas)
- Lunes: Mateo 26:14 - 25
- Martes: Mateo 26:26 - 35
- Miércoles: Mateo 26:36 - 56
- Jueves: Mateo 26:57 - 27:14
- Viernes: Mateo 27:15-54

Después de leer el Evangelio cada noche, la familia podría reflexionar juntos sobre la lectura. Concluyan su tiempo de oración juntos rezando el Padre Nuestro y/o cantando un himno apropiado, como "Jesús, Jesús", "¿Estuviste allí?" o "Qué amor tan maravilloso es este".

The Lord calls us to love God and to love our neighbor. Every day we are presented with opportunities to love our neighbor and help him "carry his cross." These opportunities aren't usually big events, they are usually ordinary occurrences like helping someone carry their groceries or holding the door open for them. The key is putting the other person's needs before our own and not expecting anything in return.

El Señor nos llama a amar a Dios y a nuestro prójimo. Cada día se nos presentan oportunidades para amar a nuestro prójimo y ayudarlo a "cargar su cruz". Esas oportunidades no son usualmente grandes eventos, son usualmente situaciones ordinarias como ayudar a alguien a llevar las compras o mantenerles la puerta abierta. La clave es poner las necesidades de los demás antes de las nuestras y no esperar nada a cambio.

# Palm Sunday


Palm Sunday is the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before he was crucified. Palm Sunday is known as such because the faithful will often receive palm fronds which they use to participate in the reenactment of Christ's arrival in Jerusalem. In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey, and to the lavish praise of the towns people who threw clothes, or possibly palms or small branches, in front of him as a sign of homage. This was a customary practice for people of great respect. Palm branches are widely recognized symbol of peace and victory, hence their preferred use on Palm Sunday. The use of a donkey instead of a horse is highly symbolic, it represents the humble arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed in war. A week later, Christ would rise from the dead on the first Easter. During Palm Sunday Mass, palms are distributed to parishioners who carry them in a ritual procession into church. The palms are blessed and many people will fashion them into small crosses or other items of personal devotion. These may be returned to the church, or kept for the year. Because the palms are blessed, they may not be discarded as trash. Instead, they are appropriately gathered at the church and incinerated to create the ashes that will be used in the follow year's Ash Wednesday observance. The colors of the Mass on Palm Sunday are red and white, symbolizing the redemption in blood that Christ paid for the world.



# Domingo de Ramos

El Domingo de Ramos es el último domingo de Cuaresma, inicio de la Semana Santa, y conmemora la llegada triunfal de Cristo a Jerusalén, días antes de ser crucificado. El Domingo de Ramos se conoce así porque los fieles suelen recibir hojas de palma que utilizan para participar en la recreación de la llegada de Cristo a Jerusalén. En los Evangelios, Jesús entró en Jerusalén montado en un burro, y ante la gran alabanza de la gente del pueblo, que arrojaba ropa, o posiblemente palmas o pequeñas ramas, delante de él en señal de homenaje. Esta era una práctica habitual para personas de gran respeto. Las ramas de palma son un símbolo ampliamente reconocido de paz y victoria, de ahí su uso preferido el Domingo de Ramos. El uso de un burro en lugar de un caballo es altamente simbólico, representa la llegada humilde de alguien en paz, a diferencia de llegar en un corcel a la guerra. Una semana después, Cristo resucitaría de entre los muertos en la primera Pascua. Durante la misa del Domingo de Ramos, se distribuyen palmas a los feligreses, quienes las llevan en una procesión ritual hacia la iglesia. Las palmas están bendecidas y mucha gente las forma en pequeñas cruces u otros objetos de devoción personal. Estos pueden devolverse a la iglesia o conservarse durante un año. Debido a que las palmas están bendecidas, no se pueden desechar como basura. En cambio, se reúnen apropiadamente en la iglesia y se incineran para crear las cenizas que se utilizarán en la celebración del Miércoles de Ceniza del año siguiente. Los colores de la Misa del Domingo de Ramos son el rojo y blanco, simbolizando la redención en sangre que Cristo pagó por el mundo.

## Paschal Triduum

The **Easter Triduum** or **Holy Triduum** is the three-day celebration of the **Paschal Mystery**: the Passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ

**PASCHAL**: associated with the Hebrew **Passover**, referring to Jesus as the Lamb of God  
**TRIDUUM**: derived from the Latin for **three days**

The Paschal mystery has two aspects: **by his death**, Christ liberates us from sin; **by his Resurrection**, he opens for us the way to a new life.

The Paschal Triduum bridges the seasons of **Lent** to **Easter**.

In the Sacred Triduum, the Church solemnly celebrates the greatest mysteries of our redemption, keeping by means of special celebrations the memorial of her Lord, crucified, buried, and risen.
