





25th Sunday In Ordinary Time - Matthew 21:28-32

Jesus poses a question to the chief priests and elders on the meaning of obedience. The example Jesus poses in today's Gospel could have been taken directly from family experience. Each of us can recall instances in which family members spoke one thing but then did another. The point of Jesus' story is to show that our actions speak louder than words, even

with God. As you gather as a family, talk about times when a family member said one thing and then did another. Acknowledge that sometimes the action taken displays a true change of heart. Then read today's Gospel, Matthew 21:28-32. Observe that Jesus faulted the religious leaders for not allowing John the Baptist's message of repentance to change their hearts and actions. The word we sometimes use for this change of heart is conversion. Jesus wants us to do more than pay lip service to the Gospel; he wants us to be transformed by his word.

Pray together that your family will experience a conversion to God and show evidence of this in both actions and words. Pray together today's second reading, Philippians 2:1-5.

"Do nothing out of selfishness; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves..."

Philippians 2:3

Pride and ego are hard things to control. We see how others act or dress and think we are superior to them. We idolize our own self-image. But, if we truly believe everything is a gift from God, we recognize all the people that God has put in our lives as gifts! We are grateful for how they enrich our lives. Pray every day for the people in your life: your family, your friends and those who make you angry.

Reading 1**Ez 18:25–28**

Thus says the LORD: You say, “The LORD’s way is not fair!” Hear now, house of Israel: Is it my way that is unfair, or rather, are not your ways unfair? When someone virtuous turns away from virtue to commit iniquity, and dies, it is because of the iniquity he committed that he must die. But if he turns from the wickedness he has committed, and does what is right and just, he shall preserve his life; since he has turned away from all the sins that he has committed, he shall surely live, he shall not die.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 25:4–5, 8–9, 10, 14
R. (6a) Remember your mercies, O Lord.

Your ways, O LORD, make known to me; teach me your paths, guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my savior. **R.**

Remember that your compassion, O LORD, and your love are from of old. The sins of my youth and my frailties remember not; in your kindness remember me, because of your goodness, O LORD. **R.**

Reading 2**Phil 2:1–11 or 2:1–5**

Brothers and sisters: If there is any encouragement in Christ, any solace in love, any participation in the Spirit, any compassion and mercy, complete my joy by being of the same mind, with the same love, united in heart, thinking one thing. Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves, each looking out not for his own interests, but also for those of others. Have in you the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus,

[Who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, o the glory of God the Father.]

Gospel**Mt 21:28–32**

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people: “What is your opinion? A man had two sons. He came to the first and said, ‘Son, go out and work in the vineyard today.’ He said in reply, ‘I will not,’ but afterwards changed his mind and went. The man came to the other son and gave the same order. He said in reply, ‘Yes, sir,’ but did not go. Which of the two did his father’s will?” They answered, “The first.” Jesus said to them, “Amen, I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you. When John came to you in the way of righteousness, you did not believe him; but tax collectors and prostitutes did. Yet even when you saw that, you did not later change your minds and believe him.”

Primera lectura**Ez 18, 25–28**

Esto dice el Señor: “Si ustedes dicen: ‘No es justo el proceder del Señor’, escucha, casa de Israel: ¿Conque es injusto mi proceder? ¿No es más bien el proceder de ustedes el injusto? Cuando el justo se aparta de su justicia, comete la maldad y muere; muere por la maldad que cometió. Acuérdate, Señor, que son eternos tu amor y tu ternura.

Según ese amor y esa ternura, acuérdate de nosotros. **R.**

Segunda lectura**Fil 2, 1–11 o bien: Fil 2, 1–5**

Hermanos: Si alguna fuerza tiene una advertencia en nombre de Cristo, si de algo sirve una exhortación nacida del amor, si nos une el mismo Espíritu y si ustedes me profesan un afecto entrañable, llénenme de alegría teniendo todos una misma manera de pensar, un mismo amor, unas mismas aspiraciones y una sola alma. Nada hagan por espíritu de rivalidad ni presunción; antes bien, por humildad, cada uno considere a los demás como superiores a sí mismo y no busque su propio interés, sino el del prójimo. Tengan los mismos sentimientos que tuvo Cristo Jesús.

[Cristo, siendo Dios no consideró que debía aferrarse a las prerrogativas de su condición divina, sino que, por el contrario, se anonadó a sí mismo, tomando la condición de siervo, y se hizo semejante a los hombres. Así, hecho uno de ellos, se humilló a sí mismo y por obediencia aceptó incluso la muerte, y una muerte de cruz. Por eso Dios lo exaltó sobre todas las cosas y le otorgó el nombre que está sobre todo nombre, para que, al nombre de Jesús, todos doblen la rodilla en el cielo, en la tierra y en los abismos, y todos reconozcan públicamente que Jesucristo es el Señor, para gloria de Dios Padre.]

Evangelio**Mt 21, 28–32**

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a los sumos sacerdotes y a los ancianos del pueblo: “¿Qué opinan de esto? Un hombre que tenía dos hijos fue a ver al primero y le ordenó: ‘Hijo, ve a trabajar hoy en la viña’. Él le contestó: ‘Ya voy, señor’, pero no fue. El padre se dirigió al segundo y le dijo lo mismo. Éste le respondió: ‘No quiero ir’, pero se arrepintió y fue. ¿Cuál de los dos hizo la voluntad del padre?” Ellos le respondieron: “El segundo”. Entonces Jesús les dijo: “Yo les aseguro que los publicanos y las prostitutas se les han adelantado en el camino del Reino de Dios. Porque vino a ustedes Juan, predicó el camino de la justicia y no le creyeron; en cambio, los publicanos y las prostitutas, sí le creyeron; ustedes, ni siquiera después de haber visto, se han arrepentido ni han creído en él”.

SAINT OF THE DAY

Saturday, September 26~ Saint Januarius

Blessed Pope Paul VI helped prepare for the Second Vatican Council, and was the one to complete it after the death of his predecessor, Pope Saint John XXIII. In 1965, he instituted the Synod of Bishops and spoke to the United Nations General Assembly during a visit to New York City.

Monday, September 28 ~ Saint Wenceslaus

More than just a name in a Christmas carol, Wenceslaus managed to rule with a clear vision of what a Christian leader should be. Many opposed him during his reign, and his brother eventually betrayed and killed him, but he continued to hold the faith and is hailed today as an outstanding king in Eastern Europe.

Tuesday, September 29 ~ Saints Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael

Angels appear frequently in Scripture, but only Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael are named. Each of these archangels performs a different mission in Scripture: Michael protects; Gabriel announces; Raphael guides.

Wednesday, September 30 ~ Saint Jerome

Known mostly for his translation of the Scriptures into Latin, Saint Jerome was also an inspiring writer of letters and commentaries. He was known to have had a bad temper, yet he was a man of prayer and penance. A combination of conflicting qualities, Saint Jerome stands out as one of the four great Doctors of the Latin Church.

Thursday, October 1 ~ Saint Thérèse of Lisieux

Saint Thérèse of Lisieux is perhaps one of the most known and best loved saints in the Catholic calendar. A young Carmelite nun who wanted to go to the missions, she remained within the cloister yet became the patron of the missions. Therese entered the convent at 15 and died at 24 having lived a full life, including serving her community as novice director. Her parents were canonized in 2015.

Friday, October 2 ~ Feast of the Guardian Angels

Angels play an important role in Sacred Scripture as messengers of God. The belief that each person has a guardian angel watching over him or her is an extension of that role, and a reminder of God's never-failing providence.

SANTO DEL DIA

Sábado, 26 de septiembre ~ S. Pablo VI

El Beato Papa Pablo VI ayudó a preparar el Concilio Vaticano II, y fue quien lo completó después de la muerte de su predecesor, el Papa San Juan XXIII. En 1965, instituyó el Sínodo de los Obispos y habló ante la Asamblea General de las Naciones Unidas durante una visita a la ciudad de Nueva York.

Lunes, 28 de septiembre ~ S. Wenceslao, duque de Bohemia

Wenceslao nace en Praga en el 907, se convierte en duque de Bohemia jovencísimo. Cristianiza su país, es noble en el sentido más alto, una vez elige combatir en duelo para no arrastrar a sus soldados a la batalla, y el adversario se reconcilia con él. Muere por manos de su hermano en el 935.

Martes, 29 de septiembre ~ Santos Miguel, Gabriel y Rafael

Los ángeles aparecen con frecuencia en las Escrituras, pero solo se nombran a Miguel, Gabriel y Rafael. Cada uno de estos arcángeles cumple una misión diferente en las Escrituras: Miguel protege; Gabriel anuncia; Rafael guía.

Miércoles, 30 de septiembre ~ S. Jerónimo

San Jerónimo fue un Padre de la Iglesia Occidental que dedicó toda su vida al estudio de las Escrituras. Buscó poner en práctica la Palabra de Dios. Como asceta y letrado al servicio del Papa Dámaso, tradujo la Biblia de los textos hebreos y griegos al latín. Murió el 30 de septiembre del 420.

Jueves, 1 de Octubre ~ S. Teresa del Niño Jesús

Santa Teresa de Lisieux o Santa Teresita del Niño Jesús, es la patrona de los misioneros y de Francia. En el centenario de su muerte, en 1997, Juan Pablo II la proclamó doctora de la Iglesia; fue la tercera mujer homenajeada con este título, después de Caterina de Siena y Teresa de Ávila .

Viernes, 2 de Octubre~ SS. Angeles Custodios

Los ángeles juegan un papel importante en la Sagrada Escritura como mensajeros de Dios. La creencia de que cada persona tiene un ángel de la guarda que la cuida es una extensión de ese papel y un recordatorio de la providencia eterna de Dios.
