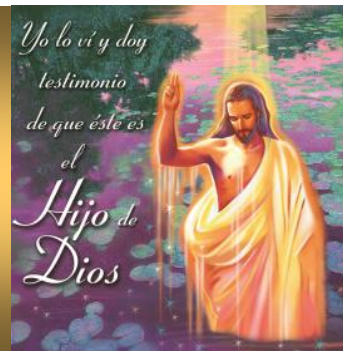

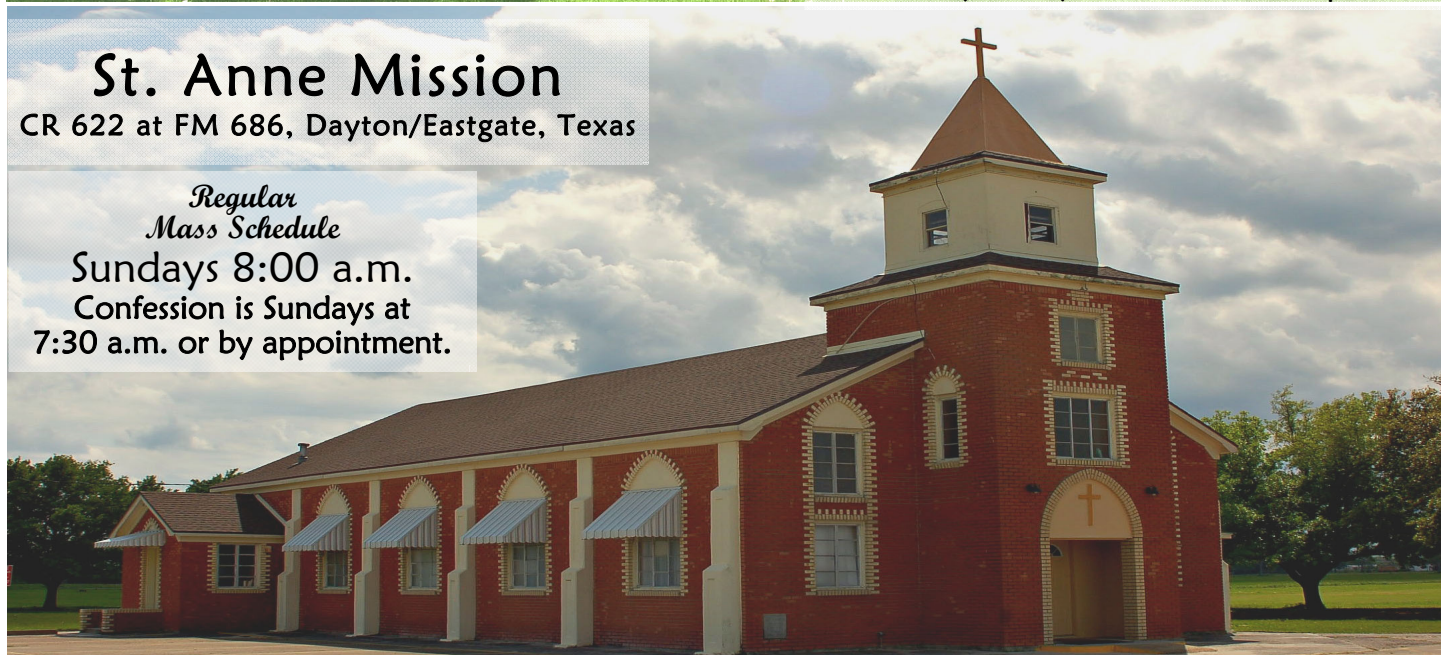

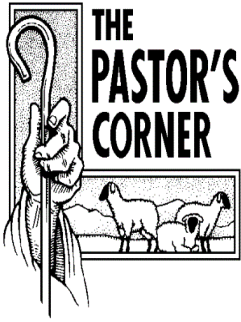

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time - John 1:29-34

The readings of today tell us that if we want to be the disciples of Jesus we must first find out who he really is for us. Jesus the Lamb of God uniquely relates God and human beings. Peter and the disciples identified him as the Son of God and in him they found the security and eternal life. He was their support and strength. Down the centuries human beings have looked at Jesus to see the kind and loving face of God. God the creator of the universe looks at Jesus his son with love and in him we see that compassionate divine

face. Today as we reflect on his word and discover him in this world we need to know what his mission is, if we want to be his good disciples. Every disciple of Jesus is a true follower of the master and is also an apostle who carries the good news to all. The Christian disciple not only follows the Gospel of Jesus but also helps others to hear and accept it also and practices it in his life. When we experience this Light in the very Person of Christ, we see the face of God shining in every human being. We are enlightened by the fact that God has joined every human being to Himself in the Incarnation. We are enlightened by the fact that no matter what the appearance or circumstances of a person's life may be age, size, shape, wealth or poverty, health or sickness, social status, level of dependency or functioning, life is always a good. It is a manifestation of God in the world a sign of his presence, a trace of his glory. Let us pray that God will help us to work together with Jesus to establish his Kingdom in the whole world and especially in that part of it where we live out our lives. As we gather around the table of the Eucharist we ask the grace from the Lord to be filled with his love, peace and joy that come to us from God our Father through Jesus Christ.

"Now the Lord has spoken who formed me as his servant from the womb..." (Isaiah 49:5)

God has given each of us different gifts. In order for God's plan to work, you have to do what God is calling you to do, and I have to do what God is calling me to do. And guess what? God has given each of us a different plan! So, stop comparing yourself to others. Don't let envy and jealousy enter your life. Be thankful for the gifts God has given you and generously share them with others.

Quinceañera

The young lady's family must be registered, participating members of the parish for at least 1 year. "Participating members" are those who faithfully attend Mass and support the Church financially (using their contribution envelopes proving such). Ideally, they should also be active in the ministry, volunteering in the Church.

The young lady must attend CCE classes faithfully for at least 1 YEAR PRIOR to the Quinceañera. She must have received the sacrament of Baptism and she must make her First Holy Communion BEFORE the Quinceañera. She must be faithfully attending Confirmation preparation classes. She, along with her Sponsor, must attend all Quinceañera preparation classes.

Please call office at least 1 YEAR BEFORE any other arrangements are made and DO NOT set a final date for the Quinceañera prior to your interview with the priest.

Quinceañera classes are held ONCE per year.

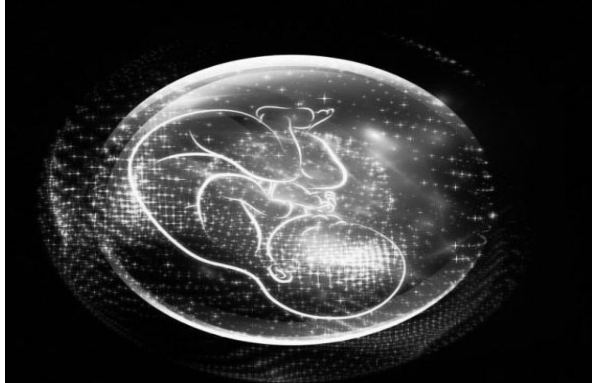

PARENT ASSIGNMENT



In baptism we are "born again" into the family of God after having been born physically into our own families. This date is at least equally as important as the date on our birth certificate.

Do you know the dates of your children's baptisms?

Today, as we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, take some time to research those dates and put them into your calendar so you can celebrate them when the time comes. Celebrate similarly to the way you would a birthday. If you can locate their baptismal candle, light it and say a prayer together, reminding them that they are called to be the "light of Christ" in the world. Offer them a sacred gift of some kind, maybe a holy medal of their favorite saint. Most of all, make sure they know this date and how important it is as the day they became part of God's family in His Church.
